Attendance matters

Being at school is important to your child's academic achievement, wellbeing and wider development. Research shows that school provides positive peer relationships, which contribute to better mental health and wellbeing. We continually monitor attendance at Stoke Prior and we aim for a minimum of 95% attendance across the school. Our current figure is 95.69%, with some children having 100% and some falling well below the threshold. If a child's attendance is below 90%, this is classed by the Department for Education (DfE) as persistent absence. We will be contacting you if your child falls into this category to see how we can help to support you with their attendance at school, or if you are concerned about your child's attendance at any time, please contact the school office.
