The Governing Body is pleased to announce that we have recruited a new Headteacher. The two-day process took place on Monday and Tuesday this week. The candidates took part in six tasks which included an assembly, questions from school council and a learning walk, followed by three written tasks in finance, data and prioritisation. The candidates also had time to meet and chat with staff who fed back to the panel. Two candidates were then invited back to the second day where they gave a presentation to the recruitment panel and were then interviewed. The results over both days were carefully considered against the person profile and one candidate was chosen. A Full Governing Body meeting then took place to formally agree and the candidate was informed and has accepted the position.

Whilst we are very excited to introduce them to you, we are respecting the wishes of their current school, not to announce their name until after half term.

The process was very rigorous and I am confident that we have made an excellent choice. I would like to thank the recruitment panel, and the staff and children for their help. All of the candidates were extremely complimentary about the behaviour of the children and the purposeful atmosphere around school which made me very proud to be part of the school.
