Heritage weekend

This weekend, as part of Worcestershire's Heritage Open Days, St Michael's and All Angels Church are holding a heritage event to celebrate and share information about Stoke Prior and its history.

Last term our Year 3 children (now Year 4) learnt all about the local area and history of Stoke Prior in their topic work. As part of the topic, they were visited by the Heritage Friends Group and were asked to create some artwork which will be on display at the event this weekend.

The heritage group will be sharing knowledge of local history including industries, people, buildings and organisations connected with the local area as well as talking about "Stories in the Stones".

On display will be pictorial and physical historical items from the world famous John Corbett salt works, the L.G Harris Brush works, local watercolours from the wife of an early Vicar of St Michael's church, a bell ringing demonstration from the Tower Team – and of course our children's wonderful pieces of artwork!

The free event will take place at St Michael's and All Angels Church on 9th and 10th September from 10am to 4pm.
