On Thursday evening this week the final school Governing Body meeting of the year will take place and it is one at which I report on all the development priorities that have taken place across the year. We also begin to plan what will happen next year as we drive continuous improvement in all areas. As part of this, it is very important to have the views of parents and carers and each year we give you the opportunity to do so using a parental satisfaction survey via a straightforward online form.

The questions follow the same format that are asked by an Ofsted inspector during an inspection and this then helps us to evaluate the school's provision in line with Ofsted. There is also the opportunity to add free text at the end so that you can provide feedback on anything else you might wish to. Once the survey is closed, we take time to analyse the responses and report back the results in a transparent manner. I appreciate that you are bombarded by feedback surveys in this day and age but this one I feel is very important. Please take the time to complete the survey as we find it very useful. The survey can be accessed here and is anonymous unless you require a specific response to questions or points raised. The survey will close on Friday 21st July and the results will be shared in the Autumn. Thank you in advance for your time.

Once the appointment has been made, I will work very hard to make sure a comprehensive transition takes place before January so that the change-over is successful.
