#### **Stoke Prior First School**

Last week, Toby and Alannah from Year 4 were invited to take part in a Worcestershire wide STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) competition held in Worcester. The children had already achieved a win during an in-school workshop earlier in the year and as a result were selected to go forward. The competition involved around 20 pupils shortlisted from nearly 3500 who took part in the classroom session, and Alannah and Toby were the youngest taking part with all other pupils being from years 5 and 6.

The brief was to design and build a demonstration model of a 3 tier racking system capable of holding a particular size box, and a system to pick the box from the shelf and move it 130mm away. The entire model had to fit within the area of an A3 sheet of paper. They had 60 minutes to do this. Not easy!

Judges from Arrow Excel delivery, VAX and Yamazaki Mazak (the hosts) moved around the schools making notes, observing the pupils working and asking questions. Both Alannah and Toby spoke confidently and enthusiastically with each judge answering every question put to them. At the end of the 60 minutes Alannah and Toby had delivered on every part of the brief. Both children really enjoyed the experience and we are really proud of them for going. Well done!
